We are excited to be planning the 2021 American Indian Elders Conference with YOU in mind. We have added some new and exciting events for you and partnered with the National Title VI Training and Technical Assistance Conference. We have added a couple of additional registration levels (see requirements for each). It has been an exciting three years of change and growth.

If you are a voting member, you will receive a copy of the updated bylaws that the current board of directors spent a week updating for you. We will be voting on these at the main voting session during the conference. Please be ready to discuss and ask questions during your regional caucus session.

In this packet you will find all the information you need to register for the upcoming conference, pay membership dues, and reserve your room at the hotel. If you want to volunteer during the conference, you can get a discount on registration of \$50, please get these forms in as soon as possible, there are limited availability. (See page 17).

We are partnering with Title VI Training and Technical Assistance Conference. If you are a Title VI Director, or an employee of a Title VI program, you can receive a discounted rate to attend the NICOA conference. Why pay to attend the NICOA conference? This allows you access to all the NICOA specific events, and meals. You do not have to be a NICOA member to receive this discount rate This is the first time we have offered this and will have training sessions that are just for you.

We are inviting the Title V & III Workforce professionals and trainees also, there will be specific workshops for them to attend and an opportunity to meet with people that usually they wouldn't cross paths with. We have added a registration rate for students, this can be anyone from High School level, to an Elder or anyone going to college. We need to get people involved in aging; we need people to carry on the torch when we have done what we can.

Those of you who are attending to take care of an Elder and would like or have to take trainings for your organization, we will have enough volunteers to help take care and assist elders so that you can attend the meetings you need to. NICOA is a New organization, with a renewed life. This is YOUR conference, NICOA presents it and puts it together for you. We have changed the format and lengthened it for a week. We have more plenary sessions, more and different workshops, more registration types and prices that you can afford. New categories of registration, allowing more people to attend and learn about our Elders and what their needs are. We will also be offering some additional events such as a dinner cruise on Lake Tahoe, a Bingo night, and other events to be determined.



We would like to take this opportunity to introduce our new Executive Director, Mr. Larry Curley, he came on board November 13, 2018. Larry is a member of the Navajo Nation with over 40 years of experience working in the aging and healthcare fields. He has worked with Congress, other branches of the federal government, and national organizations on aging to develop support for programs affecting elderly American Indians. He was an integral part of the organizing group that created NICOA back in 1976. Most recently he was named as one of the 12 most Influencers in Aging by next avenue. These 12 advocates, researchers, thought leaders, innovators, writers and experts

continue to push beyond traditional boundaries and change our understanding of what it means to grow older.

With Larry's leadership the Board of Directors and NICOA staff have put together the first Strategic Plan for the organization. We are your voice to the people in Washington, DC. Larry was instrumental in working with the Reauthorization of the Older Americans Act, where additional funding was approved by Congress.

Guidelines for Submission of Resolutions

A NICOA resolution is a statement adopted by its members to drive change. It indicates opposition or support for a change in government policy. It often requests money for programs, projects, or to support policy specific to issues that impact American Indian and Alaska Native Elders.

The resolution passed by the NICOA voting membership cover a broad range of aging topics and are equally important for providing direction to the organization and serve as advocacy tools with policy makers.

NICOA resolutions should include concise background information providing the reasoning for the position or action that you want NICOA to take.

- The resolution should address only one topic or issue. The resolution should be complete, so that when adopted it becomes a clear and formal expression of the Elders.
- ALL resolutions should be AGING related in nature to advocate for the interests of all American Indian
 and Alaska Native Elders. Resolutions that focus on regional, state or Tribal specific issues are NOT in
 order.
- A resolution endorsed by NICOA shall be the policy of NICOA until it is withdrawn or modified by subsequent resolution.
- The region submitting the resolution must select a NICOA voting member to introduce and defend the resolution before the resolutions committee and or before the voting members of the duly called biennial meeting of NICOA. (see attached sample resolution)
- Resolutions **MUST** be submitted to the NICOA Executive Director no later **45 DAYS BEFORE** the NICOA biennial meeting, postmarked no later than **JUNE 15, 2021**. Late resolutions submitted at the biennial meeting will not be accepted for consideration. The Resolutions committee must be provided sufficient time to review the resolutions to ensure that they are in order.

Resolutions **MUST BE SUBMITTED 45 DAYS PRIOR** to the NICOA biennial meeting on Friday, August 21, 2021, be postmarked no later than **JUNE 15, 2021**.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that NICOA does hereby support the passage of HR 4544 and S 2681 in the 110 th Congress, which recognizes the contributions of all American Indian Code Talkers from World War I and World War II.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be the policy of NICOA until it is withdrawn or modified by subsequent resolution.

We particularly look for those who have worked with an organization that is centered on serving AI/AN Elders, as well as those whose efforts will last beyond their lifetime.

What are the guidelines to be nominated for the Honoring Our Elders Award?

We classify our Honoring Our Elders Award winners as those candidates who are nominated by a NICOA dues paying member. Only NICOA members may nominate a candidate. If you are uncertain of your membership status, please call 505-292-2001. Any person that fits the characteristics and accomplishments above are eligible for nomination. Nomination forms must be complete and received or **post marked by June 30, 2021**

How do I nominate someone for an Honoring Our Elders Award?

Simply complete the form on the front of this sheet and submit it, along with a written (500 word maximum) summary explaining why you think your nominee should be recognized, and the names and phone numbers of people to contact regarding your nominee's activities. We recommend that a nomination form be supported by at least one (1) letter of recommendation. It is beneficial to include newspaper articles, letters, and any additional information to support your nomination.

What is the Honoring Our Elders Award nomination process?

All of the nominations we receive are acknowledged, reviewed, and evaluated. The NICOA nomination committee and staff review every nomination we receive, research those with potential, and provide the NICOA Board of Directors with a broad sampling of finalists. The board then selects one (1) award recipient from each of the three categories. Once an award recipient is selected, we must confirm with the nominee that they can be present to accept their award at our official ceremony. NICOA will provide a complementary membership, conference registration and complimentary room for two at the Nugget Casino Resort, for each of the three <u>award finalists only</u>. If the finalist is unable to attend in person, we will arrange for the award to be shipped to you. Because NICOA pays for the conference at cost we are not able to offer complimentary travel to Reno, NV. NICOA will notify the awardee in advance to allow reasonable time to arrange for sponsorship from the local community and or Tribe for travel and other costs.

How are Honoring Our Elders Award recipients honored?

Recipients are invited to a special ceremony where they are honored for their acts of caring for AI/AN Elders. We present to each winner a beautiful award to display and a framed certificate. Recipients are also profiled in the NICOA Quarterly Newsletter and on the NICOA Website.



BOARD MEMBERSHIP NOMINATION FORM

Board members represent each of the 12 NICOA Regions; and one member representing the National Association of Title VI Grantees. Each position, except for Title VI, holds a four (4) year term, that is up for election every two (2) years during our biennial conference. If a position becomes available, a person may apply for the open position, and the NICOA Board of Directors will determine if they can hold the position until the next scheduled election. (Due to the current COVID-19 issue, the positions below that are highlighted will be up for re-election/election at the 2021 conference. This will extend the other six positions to the 2023 conference.)

- Representing the organization at local, regional, and national events;
- Attend Bimonthly Board Meetings, the calendar of meetings is created in November, for the next year. These meetings are usually held on the third Thursday of every other month, at 12 pm MST. There is usually a face to face meeting three times a year at the Albuquerque office, if funds are available, NICOA will pay for your travel, per diem, and hotel accommodations;
- Working cooperatively with fellow Board members and the NICOA Executive Director to proactively represent the Elders from the area that elected you; and
- Avoiding conflict of interest between the work of NICOA and other organizations to which you belong.

When considering whether to serve as a Board member of NICOA, you must evaluate the time you have to devote to fundraising, advocacy, and governance responsibilities required of each Board member. *It is truly an honor to represent and serve fellow elders, but it is also a substantial time commitment that should be considered very carefully.*

Board members are not allowed to be paid for the services they provide on behalf of NICOA, a non-profit organization.
