The NIA is the primary federal agency responsible for research on Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. As an Institute leader, incumbent will serve as an ambassador and spokesperson for the NIA in many capacities including, but not limited to, collaborating with stakeholders and organizations across the nation and worldwide to advance the NIA mission, facilitating the identification and development of current and future leaders, serving as a role model in managing staff and financial resources with integrity and fairness, and ensuring compliance with Institute and federal policies and priorities.
